Equity in Brevard Reading Program

This program is designed to infuse diversity into reading for children in kindergarten through 3rd grade. Studies show being able to relate to the characters in books can be a very important component in helping children to engage in reading.



Mission United connects veterans, military and active duty members or family members with a caseworker who can help with emergency assistance, financial management, legal assistance with discharge and disability upgrades and other community resources.

Safety Net Services



How does United Way determine which programs, partnerships and policies are vital to supporting our community's needs?

When you give to the Community Care Fund nearly 100 volunteers spend over 1,000 hours to help determine how to meet a broad array of needs supported by both our Targeted Care and Safety Net Services.

The allocations process is an annual certification designed to give donors peace of mind that their money is being put to the best possible use in Brevard. Programs that comply with these standards have provided documentation that they meet standards in governance, operations and support to the community.
