Alan voiced his concerns over the PEARLS program and the statewide implementation of the program. Sky will be meeting with the attorney to discuss the Committee's liability concerns. The Committee received the information to review for the	
Pearls	Provider not being able to have a School Readiness contract for 5 years. However, the members requested that the Coalition staff research the ability to make the Provider's 19.20 contract conditional upon having the noncompliance items addressed. OEL stated that the Coalition cannot place additional requirements on the provider other than what the contract already includes. The last payment to the Provider has been difficult based on the paperwork that has been submitted. The Coalition staff is still asking for documents to be able to make the last payment. Out of County Contract Termination: The Committee was informed of a situation that occurred with an out of county Provider; this is the first time this type of situation has happened. The Provider attended the Brevard County Provider Meeting in October where ELC staff spoke about incident reporting and how the provider contract requires certain items to be reported to Coalition staff. After the meeting, the owner disclosed an incident that should have been reported. The center is in Sebastian and the incident happened in July 2018. As of November 13, 2018, ELC of Indian River, Martin and Okeechobee Counties as terminating their contract with TLC Preschool of Sebastian Inc. However, there are no rules action other ELCs must take when one ELC elects to terminate. The Committee reviewed the letter that was sent from the owner to ELC of IRMO (see attached). The Committee discussed the various ways ELC of Brevard may or may not take action. The ELC of Brevard staff will meet with an attorney to be advised regarding this contract and take appropriate action based on information obtained from the attorney. Alan presented the Committee with a letter that was written by	
	compliance. The Review Hearing took place on March 22, 2018 and consisted of Mark Broms, Lori Duster, and Victoria Candelora. At the hearing no new information as presented. The Review Hearing Committee was required to make a decision at the meeting; one of the members felt the time to fix the non-compliance issues was during the probation period and agreed with the Coalitions' decision of termination and not to contract with the Provider for 5 years. Other members agreed with the FY 18.19 contract be terminated, but did not agree with the
