There have been numerous legislative and General Appropriations Act approvals from the Governor's office and DEL/AELC are working to confirm the allocations for the following: \$46 million for ongoing support SR, \$20 million for Wait List assistance, \$40 million for SR Plus which is a Workforce/Existing Client support program and additional funding for Homelessness Programs. UPDATE: Finance Budget Amendment report.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Developing local county, state and federal legislative relationships to increase ELCB awareness, successful outcomes and funding support post-election shift.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>The Dolly Parton Imagination Library program launched in May/June and our Kickoff Event is today!!!!
